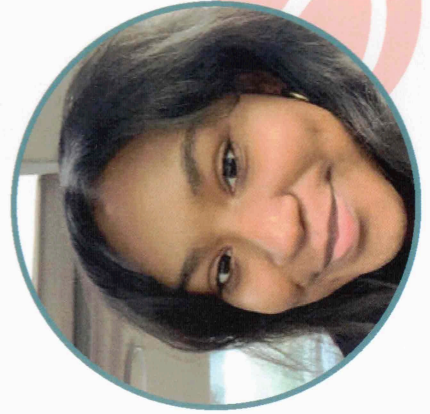


# Emergency Contraception for Every Campus

Emergency Contraception for Every Campus (EC4EC) is a grass-roots activism project launched by the American Society for Emergency Contraception. It supports bold and brave student leaders across the country as they improve access through EC vending machines and peer-to-peer distribution programs.

We provide student activists with crucial resources, mentoring, and community, including:

- Starter Kits with EC products, pregnancy tests, condoms, and information cards
- Resources and guidance to support advocacy for vending machines with low-cost EC
- Opportunities for public speaking, networking, and leadership development

As states ban and restrict abortion, the stakes for preventing pregnancy are higher than ever.

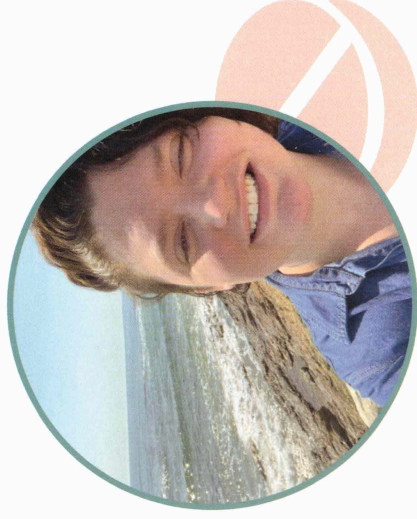
Young people who need EC often face overlapping barriers. Retail stores frequently require ID, deny EC to younger customers, and refuse to sell it on over-the-counter shelves. High cost puts it out of reach for many. These delays can mean the difference between preventing pregnancy and becoming pregnant. EC4EC works to get EC to students when and where they need it.

Interest in EC4C has skyrocketed since the *Dobbs* decision. This is the moment to grow our campus program and build student power.

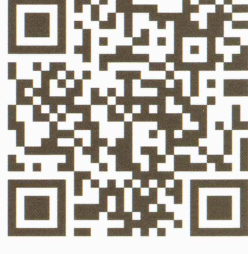

## How You Can Help

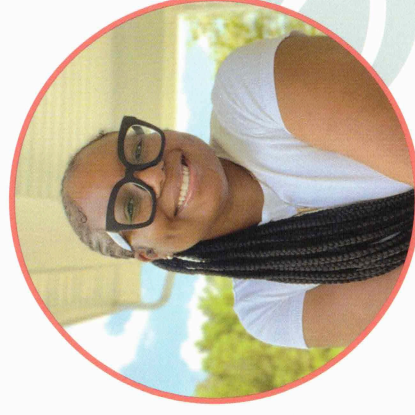
EC4EC is using the momentum of this moment to deepen the reach of our program. We are also expanding beyond college campuses to support other community activists.
